Financial Report December 31, 2018

The financial report at September 30, 2018 is for the first quarter of our fiscal year. During this quarter, we had a Nutman sale, a brat fry and a mum sale. All of these fund-raisers are on track with what we budgeted.

Membership dues are below budget. We need nine more paid members to make our budget. Four members will attend the state convention in October and five members will attend the district meeting in October.

Gift shop sales were 10 percent below last year at this time. We have many new things in the gift shop and expect sales to increase accordingly. We sent an additional \$90 to Ripon Medical Center to be added to money leftover from the water wall donation to purchase a set of barbells for the RMC Wellness Center. We also sent \$10,000 to Drug Free Communities for the Ripon Opioid Initiative.

We had \$13,738.25 in cash at the end of September.

WHAT'S NEW AT Ripon Medical Center

We have a lot going on at Ripon Medical Center these days - all exciting developments to help us continue our efforts to grow and offer as many



services as possible at a local level. I'm proud to share with you but a few of these key advancements.

Joint Commission Survey

Ripon Medical Center completed a successful Joint Commission survey in early December. Everyone did a stellar job and we are grateful for their involvement. This was a positive testament to the wonderful work done daily at Ripon Medical Center. It is with appreciation of the staff, leaders both at Ripon Medical Center and Agnesian HealthCare, and providers for the wonderful survey results and for the quality of care provided daily to our patients.

Here are a few comments that were expressed by the Joint Commission surveyors:

- Engaged staff
- Have a lot of best practices
- Keep up the great work on Chasing Zero (harm to patients' initiatives)

The surveyors were thankful for being so helpful, and that they were great to work with being willing to share and ask questions.

Walk with a Doc

Agnesian HealthCare's Walk with a Doc program at Ripon High School (summer months at Ripon Medical Center) is just entering into its second year, continuing to increase incentives for community members to join. Called Walk with a Doc, Agnesian HealthCare providers encourage their patients to join them for an opportunity to walk and have one-on-one time. Walk with a Doc is an international program designed by a board-certified cardiologist. Since its inception, Ripon participants can join for free. They can now sign up as an official member of the program at no cost and receive a T-shirt. In addition, they are able to record their miles walked to earn quarterly prizes, such as gift cards and waiving the RMC Wellness Center joiner fee. In addition, free blood pressure checks are available Tuesdays and Thursdays. Ripon Medical Center providers are walking on the first, second and third Wednesdays of each month, and the third and fourth Tuesdays from 6 to 7 p.m., and Thursdays from 5 to 6 p.m. For more information, call the Health Resource Center at 926-4960 or visit agnesian.com/walk-with-a-doc.

New Trees

Thanks to a generous donation from The Foundation at Ripon Medical Center, new fruit trees have been planted on the Ripon Medical Center campus. These trees will complement the RMC Wellness Walkway and help to create a sustainable garden for the benefit of those who use the walking path to support their overall health and well-being.

Pathway to Excellence

Ripon Medical Center has successfully submitted its first Pathway to Excellence nomination from the American Nurses Credentialing Center. The Pathway to Excellence designation identifies the elements of work environments where nurses can flourish. A designation would substantiate the professional satisfaction of nurses at Ripon Medical Center and identify it as one of the best places to work. The next phase in this process for designation is for the Ripon Medical Center nursing team to complete a survey in the next couple months.

InformaCast Emergency Mass Notification System

During emergency situations, every minute counts. Calling in critical staff for any emergency is essential to an effective response. Agnesian HealthCare is introducing InformaCast to help reduce the time and steps needed to send a mass notification for an incident that will require more staff than available on-site at the time. Alerts are generated from a web console, and sent to recipients by text, phone call or e-mail. It increases the speed, reach and success rate of emergency notification communications to get critical information to the people that need it. During an emergency, notifications can request a response to see who is safe, who needs help and who is able to assist.

Mental Illness and the Family: Recognizing Warning Signs and How to Cope

Most people believe that mental disorders are rare and "happen to someone else." In fact, mental disorders are common and widespread. An estimated 54 million Americans suffer from some form of mental disorder in a given year.

Most families are not prepared to cope with learning their loved one has a mental illness. It can be physically and emotionally trying, and can make us feel vulnerable to the opinions and judgments of others.

If you think you or someone you know may have a mental or emotional issue, it is important to remember there is hope and help.

What is mental illness?

A mental illness is a disease that causes mild to severe disturbances in thought and/or behavior, resulting in an inability to cope with life's ordinary demands and routines.

There are more than 200 classified forms of mental illness. Some of the more common disorders are depression, bipolar disorder, dementia, schizophrenia and anxiety disorders. Symptoms may include changes in mood, personality, personal habits and/or social withdrawal.

Mental health concerns may be related to excessive stress due to a particular situation or series of events. As with cancer, diabetes and heart disease, mental illnesses are often physical as well as emotional and psychological. Mental illnesses may be caused by a reaction to environmental stresses, genetic factors, biochemical imbalances or a combination of these. With proper care and treatment, many individuals learn to cope or recover from a mental illness or emotional disorder.

Warning signs and symptoms

To learn more about symptoms that are specific to a particular mental illness, search under Mental Health Information or refer to the Mental Health America brochure on that illness. The following are signs that your loved one may want to speak to a medical or mental health professional.

It is especially important to pay attention to sudden changes in thoughts and behaviors. Also keep in mind that the onset of several of the symptoms below, and not just any one change, indicates a problem that should be assessed. The symptoms below should not be due to recent substance use or another medical condition.




