# UNIVERSITIES HELPING TO SOLVE THE MENTAL HEALTH CRISIS

One in five Americans endures some form of mental health problem. Unfortunately many don't receive the behavioral health care they need due to severe shortages of mental health professionals. 1. Rethinking Mental Health Care Education, Guy Fiorita, Milwaukee Lifestyle Magazine, pp 37-38 November 2018.

These are sobering statistics, but thanks to forward thinking at three Milwaukee area universities, there are increasing numbers of mental health professionals and counselors to give clients the much needed care they require.

Marquette University, Alverno College and Mount Mary College have been adding more post graduate programs since 2011 to increase the quality and number of mental health professionals. "Interest in mental health fields are up." Dr. Douglas Woods, Prof of Psychiatry and Dean of Graduate Studies, Marquette University.

Alverno College has offered MS in Community Psychology since 2011. The college also offers an Education Specialist program that leads to both MS in Educational Psychology and Educational Specialist degrees. "We launched this program to meet the ever growing demand of Wisconsin. School Psychologists are needed in many educational
