Public Policy Report



Since 2011, the Congress and Administration have wrestled with how to reduce the federal deficit and/or raise the debt ceiling. During that time, the Congress has also wrestled with finding dollars to extend other popular provisions (Social Security payroll tax holiday) or stop unpopular provisions (Medicare physician payment cuts). For each of these situations, proposals cutting hospital payments have surfaced from Members of Congress, the Administration or commissions tasked with finding savings. With Medicare and Medicaid as significant cost-drivers in the federal budget, the Wisconsin Hospital Association anticipates hospital cuts will continue to percolate in the coming year as Congress looks for funding sources for other priorities.

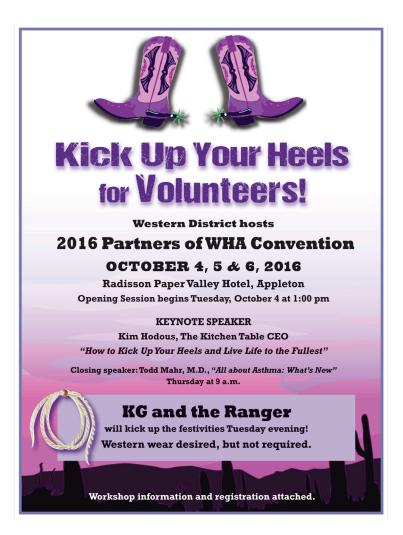

State CHE Report

The more we learn about lung disease, the greater the chances of preventing it. The one thing we know about lungs is that they are vital to our life. Just as in the past, education and prevention efforts led to a drop in heart attacks. Experts hope that as more people learn about COPD and lung cancer, fewer will actually get it. Here are three myths and facts about lung disease. Myth: Lung disease is rare. The fact is COPD is the fourth leading cause of death in the U.S. Lung cancer is the leading cause of cancer death among both men and women; about 1 out of 4 cancer deaths are from lung cancer.

Myth: Lung disease only strikes smokers. The main cause of COPD and lung cancer is smoking and exposure to secondhand smoke. But not everyone is a current or former smoker. Long-term exposure to pollutants and some occupations are riskier for lung health. There are also genetic influences. The number 2 cause of

lung cancer is exposure to the odorless radioactive gas we know as radon. Myth: It's too late to quit smoking. It's never too late to quit smoking. Your circulation improves and your lungs work better. The risk of lung cancer and COPD start to drop over time. Ten years after you quit, the odds of getting lung cancer will be half of what they are now. At any stage of COPD, quitting smoking will lessen your symptoms and slow COPD progression, and help manage the disease.

Your treatment for lung cancer may be more effective and side effects could be milder. If you need surgery, ex-smokers heal better than smokers. Fact: Exercise is important if you have lung disease. Exercise helps your lungs work more effectively. It improves the way the heart pumps. It reduces anxiety and stress and improves mood. Exercise also improves cognitive function. Fact: Early diagnosis helps. It's crucial to catch COPD and lung cancer early to prevent more damage to the lungs and increase life outcome. Fact: Everyone should try to prevent infections. Get a flu shot.
