FINANCIAL REPORT

June 30, 2018 - Here are the financial results for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2017 and ended June 30, 2018. Net fundraising and donations were 33% above budget and 28% above the prior year. Gift shop net income was 36% above budget and 21% above the prior year. We awarded three \$1,000 scholarships and donate \$14,063.46 to Ripon Medical Center.

These donations were for four patient transport chairs (\$12,727.97), a blender for Food Service (\$1,103.13), poinsettias at Christmas (\$168) and supplies for the patient hospitality cart (\$64.36). Cash remaining at the end of the fiscal year was \$22,183.46.

Membership is down slightly again this year, so please ask your friends, neighbors and relatives to be a part of our amazing organization!

The budget reflects the board's financial plan for the fiscal year that began July 1, 2018 and will end June 30, 2019. We have conservatively budgeted income and expenses to be about the same as prior years.

Between our very successful fund-raising efforts and gift shop profits, we should be able to donate more than \$18,000 to Ripon Medical Center in FY 2019. We will also continue to award three \$1,000 scholarships to high school graduates pursuing a career in health care.

WHAT'S NEW AT RIPON Medical center

We have a lot going on at Ripon
Medical Center these days - all exciting
developments to help us continue our
efforts to grow and offer as many services
as possible at a local level. I'm proud to
share with you but a few of these key advancements.



New Role

It is a privilege to be serving as interim chief operating and chief nursing officer at Ripon Medical Center. I have been enjoying my time here and appreciate getting to know personally the many individuals who help make Ripon Medical Center such a special place. Let me share a little about myself to help with introductions. I started my career at Waupun Memorial Hospital in 1985. Over the years, I have worked in the emergency department and in-service/education before moving into management. In 2004, I was named as the Waupun Memorial Hospital chief operating officer/chief nursing officer. In 2016, I also assumed system responsibilities for several areas. I have previously served in interim leadership roles for Agnesian HealthCare, first as chief nursing officer for both Waupun Memorial Hospital and St. Agnes Hospital, and second, as vice president of patient services at both hospitals. I truly appreciate all the work that the Ripon Medical Center Auxiliary does to benefit our patients and their families, and I look forward to learning more as I continue my efforts at the hospital.

3D Mammography

Ripon Medical Center will begin offering 3D mammography, which is clinically proven to significantly increase the detection of breast cancers, while simultaneously decreasing the number of women asked to return for additional testing. The new unit will be installed in late July. 3D mammography is an advanced technology in the fight against breast cancer that allows physicians to examine breast tissue one layer at a time. The imaging system uses high-powered computing to convert digital breast images into a stack of thin layers or "slices," minimizing the negative effects of overlapping breast tissue and improving cancer detection.


Joint Commission

Ripon Medical Center is anticipating a visit from The Joint Commission at any time now. A sample agenda has been sent to leaders to help with preparations. The Joint Commission has been focusing heavily on patient safety, and stories of quality and patient safety are being encouraged to share.

In addition, sample leadership and employee questions have been shared to help all feel comfortable with the overall process and have answers ready.

New Providers

Ripon Medical Center will be welcoming a new provider this fall, Danielle Fenske, DO, Family Medicine, who is scheduled to start September 10. Jason Geiger, MD, is back this summer providing Emergency Department coverage and we are discussing a longer-term contract with him.



Parking

Ripon Medical Center employees, providers and volunteers have designated spaces for parking, which allow parking spots that are closer to the facility for use with patients and their families, many which has mobility challenges. Review the attached map for staff and provider parking. Parking behind the hospital should only be used for designated services that require quick access to and from the facility.

COMMUNITY HEALTH EDUCATION

Promote safe storage and disposal of opioids and all medications.

The American Medical Association **Task Force to Reduce Opioid** Abuse strongly supports the education and awareness of physicians, patients, policymakers and other key stakeholders regarding the risks of prescription opioids and other medications if they are not taken as prescribed - as well as steps needed to ensure safe storage and disposal of expired, unwanted or unused medications.

The Task Force urges all physicians and other health care professionals to take three steps that can help:

First, physicians and other health care professionals need to talk to their patients and educate them about safe use of prescription opioids. More than 70 percent of people using opioid analgesics for nonmedical reasons get them from family or friends. Opioid analgesics should only be taken as directed since misuse or diversion of these products can be illegal, extremely harmful and even deadly.

Second, remind patients that medications should be stored out of reach of children, and in a safe place - preferably locked - to prevent other family members and visitors from taking them. The Centers for Disease Control & Prevention recommends that prescribers "discuss risks to household members and other individuals if opioids are intentionally or unintentionally shared with others for whom they are not prescribed, including the possibility that others might experience overdose at the same or at lower dosage than prescribed for the patient."

Third, talk to your patients about the most appropriate way to dispose of expired, unwanted and unused medications.

The preferred option is that unwanted or unused pills, liquids or other medications should be disposed of in a local "take back" or mail back program or medication drop box at a police station, DEA-authorized collection site or pharmacy, if the pharmacy has a secure drop-box program. Additional take back and disposal options and resources are below.

IN SUMMARY

1. More than 70 percent of people misusing opioid analgesics are getting them from family and friends - sharing opioids is illegal and may be deadly.

- 2. Store medicines out of reach from children and never share prescription(s) with anyone.
- Safely dispose of expired, unwanted and unused medications! Use pharmacy and law enforcement "take back" resources whenever possible. NOTE: RMC has a drug disposal container.
