Quarterly departments rate Volunteer Partners on Accessibility, Accuracy, Attitude, Operations, and Timeliness using a 1-4 scale. Volunteer Partners last scorecard total was 3.7. Great job!

People Goal—Increase Volunteer Engagement survey participation from 0% to 40% or 38 volunteers to complete the survey. The Engagement Survey is a way to see if volunteers are happy and identify areas of improvement. 
